## Solve

1. This month 342 volunteers will clean up 3 wetland areas. An equal number of volunteers will work in each area. How many volunteers will help clean up each wetland area?

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3. There were 972 huggers volunteering at this year's Special Olympics. The same number of huggers worked at each of the 9 events, and each hugger worked at only one event. How many huggers volunteered at each event?

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5. Marianne divided her collection of 718 stuffed animals into groups of 4. She had 6 stuffed animals left over. How do you know that she made a mistake putting the stuffed animals into groups? Explain.

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2. The Meals-on-Wheels volunteers deliver 791 meals each week. If they deliver meals each day of the week, how many meals do they deliver each day?

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4. **What's Wrong?** The third-graders collected 420 blankets this winter to give to homeless shelters. They gave the same number of blankets to 4 different shelters. Janet says that they gave 150 blankets to each shelter. What mistake did she make?

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6. Kenny has 124 baseball cards. Mark has 432 baseball cards. They combined their collection to put into an album. Each row of the album contains 8 cards. How many rows are filled? How many cards are left over?

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
