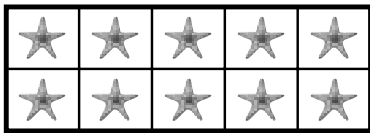
A chart to show groups of ten.

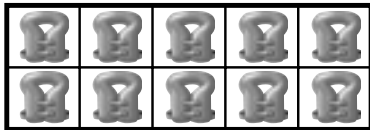
